Symposium Speeding Up the Energy Transition in Existing Buildings - Innovation Through Collaboration

The Results and Experiences of the IEBB Program

The symposium "Speeding Up the Energy Transition in Existing Buildings - Innovation Through Collaboration" will reflect on collaboration between various Dutch research institutes and companies – covering experiences of multiple IEBB projects and their follow-ups. The consortium IEBB (Integrale Energietransitie Bestaande Bouw) has the ambition to make the energy transition in the existing building stock feasible, affordable and scalable. In the framework of Multi-annual Mission-driven Innovation Programmes (in Dutch: MMIP's) dozens of researchers in the Netherlands have worked on the industrialisation of renovation concepts, the transition process and heat technologies. This symposium highlights the main findings of the consortium.

The symposium will be held at the Old Library, Raam 180, Delft on 19 November 2024 from 10:00 to 18:00. In the framework of this symposium the IEBB project WNR (Woonlasten-neutraal Renoveren – Living Cost Neutral Renovation) and the follow-up LIFE-project [CondoReno](#) will support a workshop on **Collaboration Models for Energy Renovations** covering experiences from actors, governance and business models for energy renovations. The workshop will be held in English.

Workshop Samenwerkingsmodellen voor energierenovaties - Collaboration Models for Energy Renovations

Het versnellen van renovaties van gebouwen in mede-eigendom vereist een andere manier van bedrijfsvoering. Deze sessie biedt inzichten over nieuwe bedrijfsmodellen en samenwerkingsverbanden die woningeigenaren gezamenlijk helpen om een volledig renovatietraject te doorlopen. Deze sessie wordt gehouden in het Engels.

Speeding up renovations of buildings owned by multiple owners requires a different way of doing business. This sessions offers insights about new business models and collaboration structures that help homeowners to jointly pursue a whole renovation trajectory. This session will be held in English.
