




The boundaries of sustainability of the field have been exceeded and no resources will be available for future generations.





Cumulative CO, Emissions 1850–2011 (% of World Total)






The Doughnut Economy

If our consciousness is dialogically constructed, surely, we are deeply skilled in communicative practices for listening, learning, and understanding each other." (Healey, 1996, p.219)










"Reconstructing the meaning of a democratic practice" based on more practices of "inclusionary





"DIAD"

- Diversity of Interests: the full inclusion of participants who have a stake in the problem
- Interdependence of Interests: a recognition by the participants that they must depend on each other to meet their interests
- Authentic Dialogue: the engagement of all participants in face-to-face conversations.



What can we conclude from the justice of the commons?

Cities are spaces of simultaneous COMPETITION...

and lots and lots of COOPERATION

Can the city be conceptualised as a commons in the classic sense of common property?

We can conceptualise the city as a commons if understood as the product of common work, shared by all who contribute to build and maintain it:

A "COLLECTIVE endeavour"

as conceptualised by Henri Lefebvre.

and we can all draw from the resources it provides us

(proximity, density, synergy, opportunity)

WHO does the city

belong to?

If a person cannot afford housing, do they have the right to live in the city?

Recommendations

- · Citizen empowerment + participation
- · Make coalitions & Seek consensus through communicative participatory processes
- · Listen to the most silent stakeholders: future generations, the planet, the vulnerable




